RE: Cross-border sewage and other efforts in support of the City of Coronado

Dear Representative Peters:

On behalf of the City of Coronado, I want to express my sincere gratitude for your leadership and support for Congressional action on multiple issues of concern to the City. As you know, cross-border sewage flows have been one of the primary challenges facing the City for the past decade. Your diligent work on this issue has been extremely helpful in obtaining federal resources and attention to the problem. As you are also aware, the City faces other challenges related to stormwater control, traffic and transportation. Your help on these issues has been greatly appreciated.

Within the past 12 months, your efforts have resulted in:

- \$78 million dollars in construction funds for the International Boundary Water Commission (“IBWC”) “to address urgent water management and water quality improvement programs . . . including the rehabilitation and expansion of the South Bay International Wastewater Treatment Plant”;
- Authorization for the IBWC to receive funds from other agencies and non-governmental organizations;
- \$35 million in funds for the Border Water Infrastructure Program (BWIP) which provides funding for clean water projects along the entire southern border; and
- More than \$1 million in funding for flood and stormwater management projects within the City of Coronado.

This is an extraordinary show of support for the City, and truly remarkable mustering of federal resources to protect our residents, our economy and our military. The City of Coronado values its partnership with your office and looks forward to continuing our collaboration on these important issues. Thank you for your continued dedication to our community.
