WHEREAS, March is Women's History Month, a time to celebrate the vital role of women in American history; and

WHEREAS, National Rosie the Riveter Day is a collective national effort to raise awareness of the 16,000,000 women who worked during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Americans have chosen to honor women workers who contributed to the Home Front during World War II, including through the award of a Congressional Gold Medal; and

WHEREAS, Coronado honors women workers who contributed from the home front during World War II to today with the Rosie the Riveter Rose Garden at the City of Coronado's Spreckels Center; and

WHEREAS, the City joins Coronado Girl Scouts and the Coronado Historical Association to honor those women who left their homes to work in shipyards and airplane factories in support of the Armed Forces overseas yearly; and

WHEREAS, through Girl Scouting, girls gain courage, confidence, and character who make their local communities and the world a better place; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to recognize and preserve the history and legacy of working women during World War II for future generations of girls and women; and

WHEREAS, March 21, 2026, during Women's History Month, is an appropriate day to designate as "Rosie the Riveter Day."


NOW THEREFORE, on behalf of the City Council of the City of Coronado, I do hereby recognize and proclaim March 21, 2026 as:

in the City of Coronado.


